organizations help people locally and around the country in their time of need. Just one angel item makes a difference in the lives of those who receive. Please consider taking an angel or two and placing the requested items under the tree by **December 31st**.

A **Blessing Bucket** is a five gallon bucket filled with essential items that are used by individuals every day. When received, these buckets help to enrich lives and become a small token of God's love. God's Pit Crew delivers tractor trailer loads of Blessing Buckets to some of the hardest hit areas after a natural disaster.

The **Closet of Blessings** provides clothes, shoes, diapers, bathing supplies, blankets and even some cribs and beds for children identified by both the City of Danville and Pittsylvania County Social Services departments.

Many of the items go to emergency foster care parents, who take in children who had to be removed from their homes and parents in emergency situations, and usually come with just what's on their backs.

members of the church are welcome to join the youth group to join in on the fun!




Thank You!

Communion Classes

How do I know if my child is ready for Communion? Has your child asked? Have you asked your child if he/she wants Communion? Does

your child imitate your actions at the altar rail? Does your child watch what you do at the rail? Has your child put his/her hands out to receive? These are good signs that your child is ready.

We are looking at having Communion Classes for our youth offered during the new year. These classes can be after church, during Sunday school or another day that may work for the majority of schedules. There is no specific age for the classes; this is a family decision. Communion is available to all those who have been baptized at any age. The process of the classes allows the student to understand the significance of taking communion and learn more about the Episcopal service and traditions as well.

The Sunday School class has been working our way through Genesis. We of course began "In the beginning," journeyed with Noah, his family, and the animals on the ark, we have climbed the mountain with

What is Advent?

The History of Advent

The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word *adventus*, meaning "coming," which is a translation of the Greek word *parousia*. Scholars believe that during the 4th and 5th centuries in Spain and Gaul, Advent was a season of preparation for the baptism of new Christians at the January feast of Epiphany, the celebration of God's incarnation represented by the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus (Matthew 2:1), his baptism in the Jordan River by John the Baptist (John 1:29), and his first miracle at Cana (John 2:1). During this season of preparation, Christians would spend 40 days in penance, prayer, and fasting to prepare for this celebration; originally, there was little connection between Advent and Christmas.

By the 6th century, however, Roman Christians had tied Advent to the coming of Christ. But the "coming" they had in mind was not Christ's first coming in the manger in Bethlehem, but his second coming in the clouds as the judge of the world. It was not until the Middle Ages that the Advent season was explicitly linked to Christ's first coming at Christmas.

Advent Today

Today, the season of Advent lasts for four Sundays leading up to Christmas. At that time, the new Christian year begins with the twelve-day celebration of Christmastide, which lasts from Christmas Eve until Epiphany on January 6.

Advent symbolizes the present situation of the church in these "last days" (Acts 2:17, Hebrews 1:2), as God's people wait for the return of Christ in glory to consummate his eternal kingdom. The church is in

a similar situation to Israel at the end of the Old Testament: in exile, waiting and hoping in prayerful expectation for the coming of the Messiah. Israel looked back to God's past gracious actions on their behalf in leading them out of Egypt in the Exodus, and on this basis they called for God once again to act for them. In the same way, the church, during Advent, looks back upon Christ's coming in celebration while at the same time looking forward in eager anticipation to the coming of Christ's kingdom when he returns for his people.

Advent Liturgy and Practice

To balance the two elements of remembrance and anticipation, the first two Sundays in Advent look forward to Christ's second coming, and the last two Sundays look backward to remember Christ's first coming. Over the course of the four weeks, Scripture readings move from passages about Christ's return in judgment, to Old Testament passages about the expectation of the coming Messiah, to New Testament passages about the announcements of Christ's arrival by John the Baptist and the Angels. While Advent is certainly a time of celebration and anticipation of Christ's birth, it is more than that. It is only in the shadow of Advent that the miracle of Christmas can be fully understood and appreciated; and it is only in the light of Christmas that the Christian life makes any sense. The promise for Israel and the promise for the church is Jesus Christ; he has come, and he will come again. This is the essence of Advent.
