The fruits of the Spirit are Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness and Self Control *Galatians 5:22-23*. These are easy to say, at least when you hum the catchy tune, but not as

easy to do daily in our lives. We are tested daily on following these 9 character actions. How many of us can say we showed all of them in all we did even in one day? We also fixed the sidewalk at the Columbarium to allow for a gradual entry for handicapped accessibility as well as removed a trip hazard that was in place. The Vestry will be working towards a decision on when to pave the parking lot and how to finance that endeavor this year if possible. After, the work has been done, we will be looking at how to re-landscape the church grounds to make our area look less "naked".

The Music Committee, consisting of Gary Sullivan, Sherry Gott, Kathy Northen and Will Adkins, was also formed since the Annual Meeting. They are working together monthly to plan the service music as well as coordinate the special music. On Saturday, February 8th, a funeral service was held for **Mary Biddlestone** at Christ Church. The service was presided over by Rev. Bob Hamilton, a dear friend of Mary's for many years, with former Rector and friend of Mary, Cleon Ross giving the eulogy. A reception hosted by the

Christ Church ECW followed the service. The service was well attended by family, friends, and fellow church members.

Mary's ashes were scattered in front of the church under the stained glass window above the altar. Mary's husband Robert Biddlestone's ashes were scattered in the same location in May of 1998. There was not a columbarium on church property at the time of Robert's death, and Mary was one of the leading advocates for the establishment of the Holy Spirit Prayer Garden and Columbarium. A stone cross marker was added to the wall of the Prayer Garden, just above the one that was there for her beloved husband.
