Though I have not seen the movie yet, I am excited to see the film adaption. The story is sort of a prequel to The Wizard of Oz and how the Wicked Witch became who she was in the Wizard of Oz. God calls us to love one another in who we are and where we are in life. He reminds us that even the least of us is important in His kingdom.

As we step into the Advent season and prepare for the coming of the Christ Child, I hope we will all remember it is a tiny baby who reminded this World how to love not just our friends, but those who are different or differ in opinion from us, too. We may not always understand why that person feels that way or has those opinions, but it is better to love than to hate, and pray instead of argue.

This year at Christ Church is coming to a close and another year is upon us. I urge you to think this Advent season about what we as a church and you yourself can continue to do to spread God's message in our community. I ask you to think about your role in your faith and in this church. What can we do better? What needs to be done in the future and where do we go from here? Your Vestry needs your input and looks forward to discussing these ideas in the upcoming year.
